Start with the master prompt

Lock the sequence

Tell ChatGPT to create image 1 of 10 first, then continue automatically through the remaining scenes.

Change the action every time

3

Give each person a separate action and expression. Avoid repeating the same food, pose, camera angle, or joke.

Repeat the height rule

4

Keep the relative-height sentence in every scene prompt so perspective does not accidentally reverse the height order.

Correct only the failed detail

5

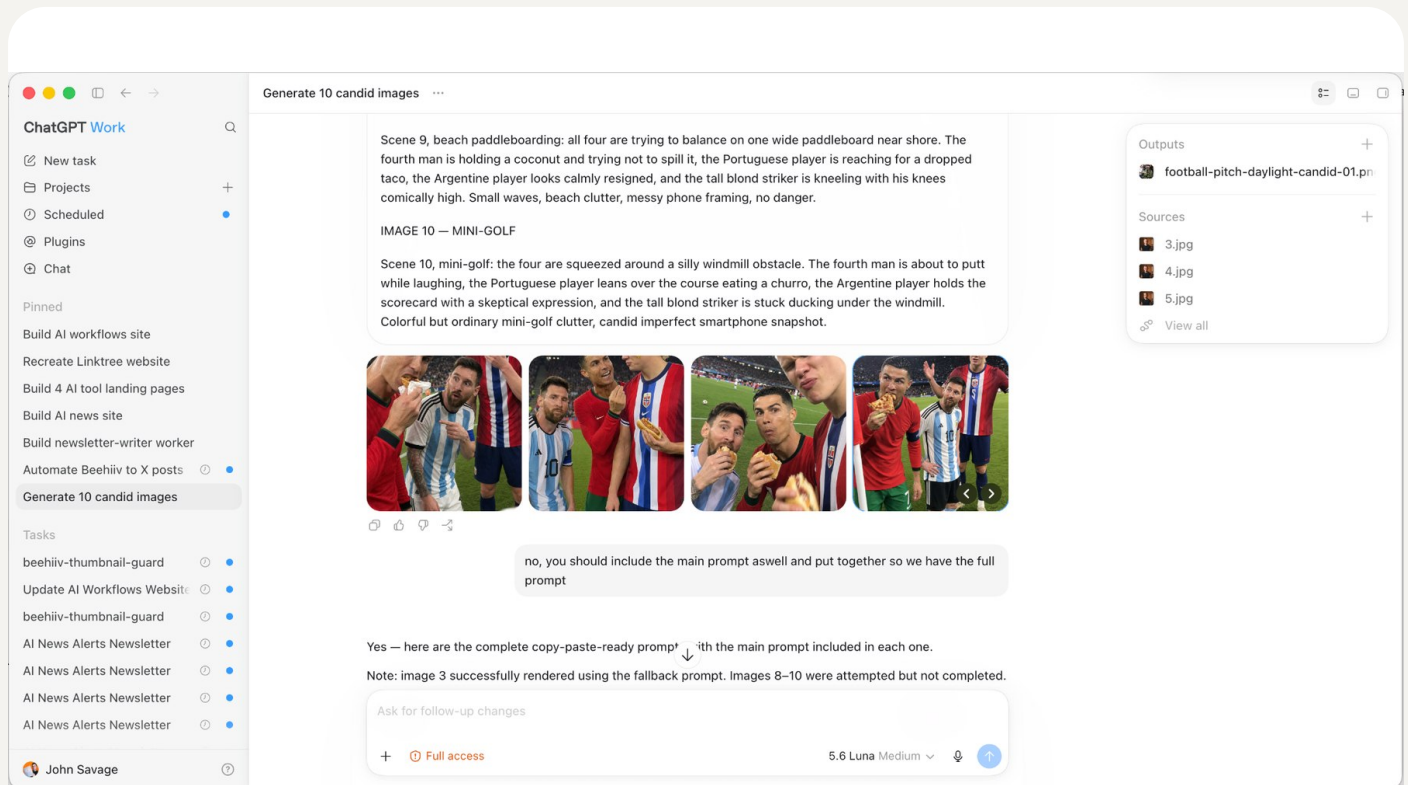
When one image is wrong, ask for that image to be redone instead of restarting the full set.

The new Work interface is designed for longer tasks that create and organize finished outputs.



WHY IT HELPS

For allowed requests, ChatGPT Work is a better fit for a 10-image sequence because it can keep the task running, organize outputs, preserve the project context, and let you redirect the workflow while it works.

Important: it does not bypass guardrails. Requests that violate safety policies can still be refused, modified, or stopped. The advantage is persistence and project organization for requests that are allowed - not the removal of safety checks.

Best setup

- Create one dedicated project for the full image set.
- Attach all references before starting the run.

- Ask it to save every image as a separate output.

What makes the images feel real

Camera

Motion

Blur at least one hand, foot, prop, strand of hair, or falling object.

Expressions

Give every person a different face, eyeline, and reaction.

Interaction

Make each person respond to the same small event instead of posing independently.

Height

State the real relative-height order and keep everyone on comparable ground.

Texture

Keep skin, sweat, clothing wrinkles, noise, and compression visible.

Variation

Change the action, camera distance, framing, food, prop, and location detail.

WHEN AN IMAGE LOOKS TOO CLEAN
